<p>Provision of Basic Services to the urban poor ----- As per information obtained from States on each seven basic services for urban poor.</p>		<p>Andhra Padesh (Vishakhapatnum City) Affordable Houses and land tenure- There are about 1.27 lakh households(HH) required housing of which about 67,000 hh were covered prior to JNNURM, leaving a deficits of 60,000 during the Mission Period. Till date about 53,920 HH (89.86% of the deficit) are covered and houses are being handed over and rest will be covered in balance Mission Period. Water Supply- No public taps were provided since 2002-03. A target of about 32,000 was initially planned for individual house service connections. The target was increased later on to 44,000 in the Mission Period. Of which 31,982 connections (i.e., 99% of initial target and 72.40% of the enhanced /revised target) are the given in the Mission Period so far.</p>

Sanitation- Prior to JNNURM only 3.56% of the city (area wise) and 23% population wise (approx. 3.76 lakh) is covered. During the Mission Period, it was proposed to cover another 17% of the area and 40% of the population i.e., 6.54 lakhs (1.30 lakh HH) with Sever connections, which includes 2.15 lakh (0.42 lakh HH) slum population. Thus out of target of 42,000 HH, 36,850 HH sever connection were given achieving a target of 87.70%.

Education - The population of 6.40 lakhs basically residing in the poor settlements is being covered through 317 Schools within a radius of 2 km from slum.

Health - 6.40 lakhs slum population are being covered with 20 Urban Health Centres located about 2 km of the slum boundaries.

Social Security - (1) Social Security pensions Viz. widow, old age, weaver and disabled are being given to a tune of about Rs. 147.31 lakhs per month (17.68 crores per annum).

(2) An insurance coverage is provided for 13,768 Self Help Groups (SHGs) in slums.
